

# Culzean

153miles/246km



## Trip Summary

- Slower coastal roads
- Some motorway riding
- Towns and villages
- Sea views

- 1 Take the A82 from Balloch towards Glasgow and cross the Clyde using the Erskine Bridge, then head to Greenock using the M898, M8 and A8.
- 2 From Greenock follow the A78 to the scenic Ayrshire coastal road and perhaps stop in the popular coastal town of Largs.
- 3 Continuing your journey on the A78 down the coast and around Irvine.
- 4 Take the A79 past Prestwick and through Ayr. Ride along the A719 with its magnificent views over the Firth of Clyde to Arran.
- 5 Visit Culzean Castle [pronounced Kullaine], designed by Robert Adam, or just enjoy lunch in the cafeteria located in the Castle's old stables.
- 6 Return on the B7023 to Maybole before heading north again on the A77, but be careful of the speed restriction cameras.
- 7 At Fenwick join the M77 for a faster ride back to Glasgow, then switch to the M8 to cross the Erskine Bridge and return to Balloch.
